To prioritize highway improvement projects that promote national defense, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Warrior Road Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. CIVIL DEFENSE.
- 6 Section 310 of title 23, United States Code, is
- 7 amended by striking "to consult, from time to time, with
- 8 the Federal Civil Defense Administrator relative to the
- 9 civil defense aspects of highways so constructed or recon-

structed" and inserting "to develop a priority listing containing the 3 highest priority projects from each State rel-3 ative to the civil defense aspects of highways so con-4 structed or reconstructed. At least every 2 years, the Secretary shall consult with the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to consider whether to 6 update such listing or to reprioritize projects. The Sec-8 retary shall submit each listing, and any update carried out pursuant to this section, in an electronic format to 10 each Member of Congress". SEC. 3. REPORT ON HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS 12 THAT PROMOTE NATIONAL DEFENSE. 13 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 14 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-15 tation, in consultation with the Secretary of War, shall submit to Congress, including in an electronic format to 16 each Member of Congress, a report that contains a list 17 18 of highway improvement projects that— 19 (1) would promote national defense consistent 20 with the core purposes of highway funding; and 21 (2) are designated as important to national de-22 fense pursuant to section 210 of title 23, United 23 States Code. 24 (b) HIGHEST Priority Projects IN EACH STATE.—The list compiled pursuant to subsection (a)
